

IBRARIES Chewelah Public Library

The Chewelah Public Library was established in 1914 by the Chewelah Women's Club. In 1923, the City of Chewelah began funding the library and settled into its current location in 1986. The library has played a vital role in providing access to information and resources to area residents and visitors. In 2019, the library was visited 107,000 times, circulated almost 70,000 items, and provided over 171 programs for people of all ages, including early literacy activities, local author talks, science and technology learning opportunities, and more.

The Chewelah library building was purchased from the City of Chewelah in 2018. Significant improvements are needed to ensure that the facility can meet community needs. These include adding a restroom, reconfiguring spaces to create a flexible meeting and reading area, private study rooms, and replacing the front doors to improve access for those with mobility issues. Other infrastructure enhancements include replacing furniture, windows and carpeting, upgrading fire alarm and electrical systems and improving staff work areas. Together, these improvements will support increased use of technology and meet the needs of this busy library.

The library district has received a grant from the state to partially fund these improvements, but the grant must be matched by local fundraising. The total cost of planned improvements to the Chewelah Public Library is \$195,000.

The Fundraising Campaign to Improve Library Facilities

It is an exciting time for our libraries! Based on demonstrated need, four of our libraries received grants totaling \$1,021,333 through the State of Washington's Library Capital Improvement Program. These grants, which must be matched by local fundraising, will benefit Chewelah, Colville, Loon Lake, and Northport. We are building upon this opportunity to expand services and make improvements to all libraries in Stevens County.

Our total budget for these improvements (including the \$1.02 million in grants already received) is \$2,262,971. Funding will come from library savings, in-kind donations (e.g. labor), and your generous donations.



Volunteers from each library, local Friends groups, the Colville Public Library Improvement Club, and the Library of Stevens County Foundation are taking the lead on raising the funds to support these improvements.
