

Loon Lake Library

Built in 1974, the current Loon Lake Library is an essential community resource. In 2019, the library was visited over 4,000 times, circulated almost 25,000 items, and provided over 62 programs for people of all ages, including early literacy activities, local author talks, science and technology learning opportunities and more.

Although well-used by the community, the Loon Lake Library facility has many issues, including limited spatial capacity, aging facility in need of substantial repairs, and lack of ADA accessibility. A 2019 assessment by a local architect determined that building a larger new library in a new location would be the best way to meet the needs of the greater Loon Lake community.

To fund the new Loon Lake library, the library district sought and received a grant from the state, but the grant must be matched by local fundraising.

The Fundraising Campaign to Improve Library Facilities

It is an exciting time for our libraries! Based on demonstrated need, four of our libraries received grants totaling \$1,021,333 through the State of Washington's Library Capital Improvement Program. These grants, which must be matched by local fundraising, will benefit Chewelah, Colville, Loon Lake, and Northport. We are building upon this opportunity to expand services and make improvements to all libraries in Stevens County.

Our total budget for these improvements (including the \$1.02 million in grants already received) is \$2,262,971. Funding will come from library savings, in-kind donations (e.g. labor), and your generous donations.



Volunteers from each library, local Friends groups, the Colville Public Library Improvement Club, and the Library of Stevens County Foundation are taking the lead on raising the funds to support these improvements.
